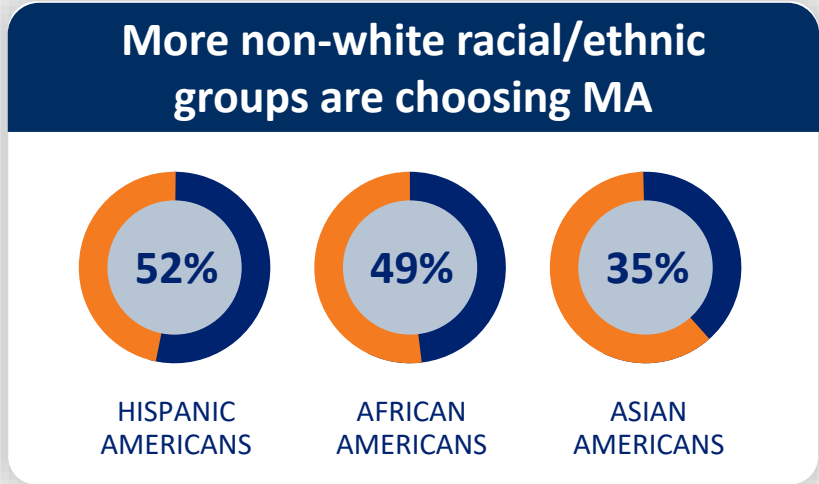


Medicare Advantage Enrollment Growing Among Non-White Beneficiaries, But Data is Sparse

Better reporting required to understand and address health disparities

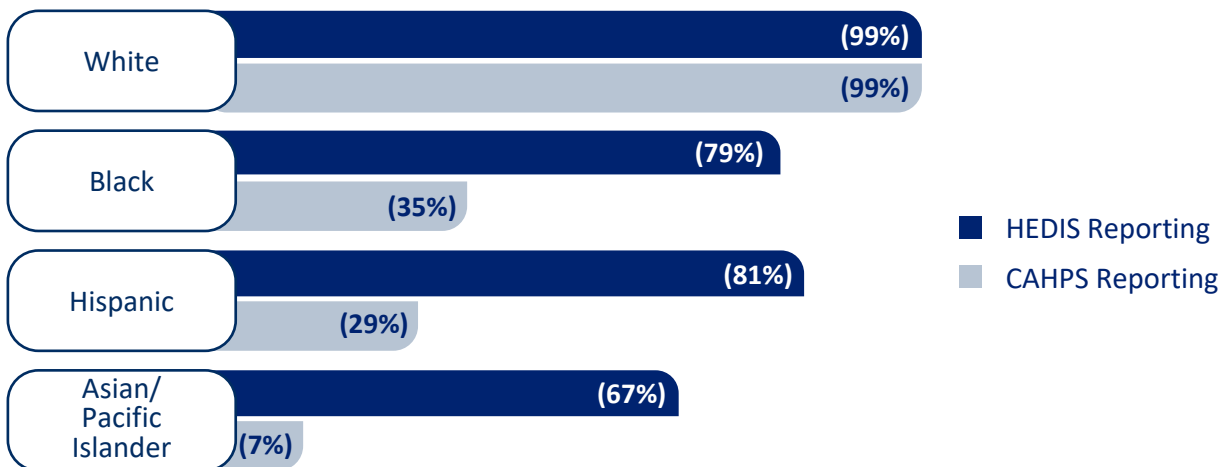
MA enrollment among non-white racial groups grew by more than 37% between 2013-2018.¹

MA plans significantly under report for non-white racial/ethnic groups on HEDIS & CAHPS measures.



Stratified CAHPS & HEDIS Quality Reporting Reveal Lack of Reliable Data for Non-White Racial/Ethnic Groups

There is significant under-reporting for CAHPS measures for non-white racial/ethnic groups. HEDIS measures, primarily sourced from electronic medical records, have more reliable data for non-white racial/ethnic groups.²
