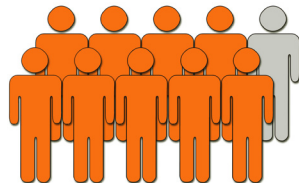

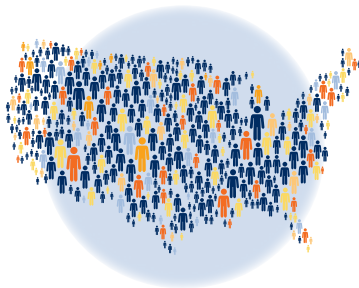


On average,
